

Arkansas 4-H Livestock Leadership Class

Eligibility and Purpose

The Arkansas 4-H Livestock Leadership Class (LLC) will be a yearlong program designed to increase 4-H'ers (ages 15-19) knowledge of professionalism, leadership, advocacy, Arkansas agriculture, and legislative affairs as it relates to animal agriculture. LLC will be comprised of 10-15 4-H'ers. LLC will take place through a series of 4 sessions from June - March. 4-H'ers must complete a total of 20 hours of livestock community service.

Application and Selection

Applicants must submit the online application by the due date. Applicants must also submit a 2 minute introduction and justification video on why they believe they should be chosen to be a part of the Arkansas 4-H Livestock Leadership Class. County Extension Agent information will be collected in the application and agents must approve applications from their county.

Need to Know

Those selected for the Arkansas 4-H Livestock Leadership Class must be able to attend all 4 sessions. Dates listed below. Additionally, after the first session, 4-H'ers must undergo a 100 question quiz and pass with at least an 80%.

LLC participants will be responsible for expenses associated with attending the sessions. Sponsors are solicited to help keep expenses to a minimum.
